1. What does New Durham have to support the Outdoor

Recreation Economy?

- Partner with schools-community trail to school, promoting ski school, using the ballfield for events, Birchridge, lowering barriers to use with recreation rentals at library.
- Develop existing assets with a focus on residents and property owners.
- Hiking trails, snowmobiling, and hunting.
- Additional ramp that charges for service not related to full-time town citizens, and vacation rentals.
- Elder hostel.
- Campgrounds with camp hosts, snowmobile trails, using
 Facebook to promote outdoor events, strong Rec Director.
- Trails, ballpark, Club Pond, Outdoor Outfitters shop, lake, river, fishery, SELT, campgrounds.
- Recreation Department.
- Club Pond Sponsors scouts and other groups.
- Seasonal campgrounds, eco-tourism focus, hiking, outdoor education, elder hostel.

Outdoor education programs for children and adults, like Prescott
 Farm in Laconia.

2. What does New Durham need to better support the Outdoor

Recreation Economy?

- Promote natural features that are already well known. Follow the model of Mount Major to use natural features to attract seasonal businesses/business competition for outdoor recreation.
- Meal tax does not come back 1-for-1 to town. Foxy Johnny's, eco-tourism, homestead education, historic sites, and the Elder Hostel are underutilized.
- Food trucks, town maps, maintenance of logging roads, paid parking for town rec department to offset costs.
- Keep promotions local. Overpopulation is the problem.
- Meeting house events, farmers market, snowmobile club.
